Plant List from Haagen Daz Honey Bee Haven

1. Some of the plants listed are fruit trees, vegetables, and other edibles. The Haven is working on crops that need good pollination. You can disregard these plants if you're just looking for flowers.
2. The bolded plants are plants that I personally have used successfully but don't hesitate using the others on the list.
3. The soil for all my plantings has been double dug. This means carefully breaking up all planting beds two shovel blades deep at least. I don't dig holes I break up entire areas usually five feet wide by ten feet long.
4. I dig in a 6-8" layer of compost to most beds-sometimes more! You have to be careful though with using this much compost in beautiful loose soil. It's easy to over water the plants. Compost dose a fantastic job of holding water in the soil. Water new plants checking for dry soil every few days until established (two or three weeks). A good example of are plants that can be touchy with compost and water are plants like Lavender which don't usually like a great deal of organic compost because the soil stays too moist for them-they can rot quickly. Other plants like Verbascum love the compost and moisture. Don't be surprised if a few plants die off suddenly-it's part of learning. As you experiment with compost and mulches eventually you will learn which plants love the rich soil and which plants hate moist rich soil. Slowly but surely we can group the plants accordingly. The question of soil moisture and compost should be one of the first questions we ask when planting new plants at our house. Most native plants really don't need a lot of organic amending just loose soil and that means lots of digging to break up compaction layers. Mulches on top of the soil are fine for natives.

5. Some of my favorite plants so far in my new garden are: *Gillardia* ‘Arizona Sun’, *Echinacea* ‘Magnus’, *Nepeta* ‘Walkers Low’, *Salvia Chamaedryoides*, *Verbascum* ‘Wedding Candles’, Sunflowers, *Buddleja* cv. Buzz Midnight, *Caryopteris* ‘Blue Mist’, ‘Dark Knight’, ‘Blue Boa’.
